GLENTHORNE AVENUE AND ST GEORGES AVENUE) (YEOVIL)
(CONTROLLED PARKING ZONES) (REVOCATION AND NO LOADING)
(GLENTHORNE AVENUE) (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING ON SCHOOL
KEEP CLEAR MARKINGS) ORDER 2015

SOMERSET COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) and 32 35 36 45 and 46 and part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act HEREBY MAKES THE FOLLOWING ORDER:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 16th day of July 2015 and may be cited as 'The County of Somerset (Chelston Avenue, Elmhurst Avenue, Glenthorne Avenue and St Georges Avenue) (Yeovil) (Controlled Parking Zones) (Revocation and No Loading) (Glenthorne Avenue) (Prohibition of Stopping on School Keep Clear markings) Order 2015'.
2. IN this Order: –
 - a) "disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - b) "disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000; and
 - c) "parking disc" have the same meanings respectively as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;
 - d) "electronic communications apparatus" means apparatus comprised or to be comprised in an electronic communications network as defined in the Communications Act 2003;
 - e) "enactment" means any enactment whether public, general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;
 - f) "postal packet" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - g) "provision of a universal postal service" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - h) "relevant position" and "parking disc" have the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) (Regulations) 2000;
 - i) "traffic sign" has the same meaning as in Section 64 of the Act of 1984; and
 - j) "universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

- k) "parking attendant" has the same meaning as in section 63A of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - l) "school keep clear" is a road marking to diagram 1027.1 and sign to diagram 642.2A that has been placed on the road in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 as amended,
 - m) "vehicle", unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether or not by mechanical power;
2. (a) a disabled persons badge in the relevant position when: -
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of an immediately behind the windscreen.
 - (ii) In the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the front nearside of the vehicle and
- (b) a parking disc in the relevant position when the disc is exhibited therein with the side which shows the time facing outwards and immediately behind the windscreen or side window nearest to the kerb.
3. SAVE as provided in Articles 5 and 6 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Parking Attendant employed by the Local Authority, cause or permit any vehicle to wait, load and unload on the sides of road or in the lengths of road as shown in schedule 1 below.
4. NO PERSON shall, cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the School Keep Clear Markings at any time on the sides of road or in the lengths of road as shown in schedule 3 below.
5. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait, or load and unload on the sides of the road or in the lengths of road specified therein for so long as may be necessary to enable -
- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle
 - (b) goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle outside of the controlled times as specified in the schedule to this order
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely: -
- (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said lengths of road or side of roads; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or side of roads, of any sewer or of any main,

pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (v) the provision of a universal postal service as defined in the Postal Services Act 2000;
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (e) the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the said sides of road of lengths of road;
 - (f) the vehicle to wait at or near to any premises situated on or adjacent to the said sides of road of lengths of road for so long as such waiting is reasonably necessary in connection with any wedding or funeral or;
 - (g) the vehicle to be used for Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police purposes.
5. NOTHING in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver or other person in charge if the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides of road or in the lengths of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval or less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on that side of road or in that length of road).
6. ***THE prohibitions and restrictions imposed by the Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.***
7. Any existing loading/unloading restrictions as specified in schedule 2 of this order are hereby revoked.
