(24 HOUR CLEARWAY AND REVOCATION) ORDER 2017

SOMERSET COUNTY COUNCIL in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1), and parts III and IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, and The Traffic Management Act 2004 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as "Somerset County Council (A361 Piltown to the A37 Fosse Way) (A37 Whitstone Road Roundabout Junction to Wraxall Crossroads) (A371 Prestleigh Hill) (24 Hour Clearway and Revocation) Order 2017 and shall come into force on the 22nd June 2017.
2. Save as is provided in Article 5 no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any motor vehicle to stop or wait on the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order.
3. The plan annexed to this Order and marked Extent of Clearway is for identification purposes only.
4. In this Order: –

"carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles;

"lay-by" means any area of carriageway adjacent to the main carriageway intended for the waiting of or passing of vehicles;

"main carriageway" means any carriageway used primarily by through traffic, and includes any carriageway of a slip road, but excludes any lay-by;
5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait along those lengths of road for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations:
 - (a) fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (b) in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (c) any building operation or demolition;
- (d) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (e) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road comprising or including that carriageway;
- (f) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to, the said lengths of road or side of roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (g) a vehicle waiting on the main carriageway referred to in Article 2 while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access, or from which it has emerged, is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on that carriageway; or
- (h) a vehicle waiting when the person in control of the vehicle is required to stop by law, or is obliged to stop in order to avoid an accident or is prevented from proceeding by circumstance outside their control.

6. Save as provided in Article 7 nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall prohibit a person to cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait in a lay-by.

7. Article 6 shall not apply for the duration of the Glastonbury Festival (during the period when public access to the festival site is permitted) when no person shall, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer, cause or permit any motor vehicle to stop or wait in a lay-by located adjacent to the main carriageway within the extents of the Clearway restriction.

8. Insofar as any provision of this Order conflicts with any previous Order relating to the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order, that provision of this Order shall prevail.
