Upgrading parts of footpaths WN 23/12 and WN 23/38 to bridleway status and adding a section of bridleway in the parish of Queen Camel.

The application route runs from the A303 at ST 5959 2573 (point H) north north eastwards along Hazelgrove Lane to the north west corner of the Sparkford Hall lands at point D (ST 6016 2674) where it joins the route of another application.
