### **The Seeing Ear**

The Seeing Ear is a registered charity which provides an online library for visually impaired, and people who have difficulty reading print, in the UK. The service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and is free to members. Teachers, parents and carers can join on behalf of somebody with a visual impairment or print disability.

To make them as accessible as possible, the electronic books are available in plain text or MS Word files. These can be downloaded and enjoyed using the member's preferred device and/or method, including large print, synthetic speech, and Braille. More books are being uploaded daily.

The Seeing Ear website provides all the information needed to help people join their service, and if there are any issues, they are always
