

**Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004
The Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations
2012**

Adoption of a local plan (known as the Somerset Waste Core Strategy)

Somerset County Council resolved to adopt the Somerset Waste Core Strategy on 20th February 2013.

This document sets the planning policy for sustainable waste management in Somerset until 2028, and will be used to decide waste planning applications submitted to the County Council.

The Somerset Waste Core Strategy, Sustainability Appraisal and this Adoption Statement can be viewed, free of charge, at the following places:

- In printed copy at Somerset County Council, County Hall, Taunton, TA1 4DY (during normal opening hours)
- In printed copy at District Council offices in Somerset (during normal opening hours)
- Online on the Somerset County Council website <http://www.somerset.gov.uk/mineralsandwaste> and via Public libraries (during normal opening hours)

Any person aggrieved by the Somerset County Council Waste Core Strategy may make an application to the High Court under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 on the grounds that:

- The document is not within the appropriate power; or
- That a procedural requirement has not been complied with.

Applications must be made within six weeks following the date of adoption of this plan, and must be received by no later than the 3rd April 2013.
