Welcome to the 2019 edition of the Secondary Admissions – A guide for Parents which is designed to assist parents/carers whose child/children are due to transfer from a primary to secondary school or from a middle to upper school in September 2019. It will give you all the information and advice that you need on how and when to apply for your child's school place, help you through the application process, and tell you how school places will be allocated.

Somerset should be a place where families thrive, and all children learn and develop well from their earliest years. 

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When can my child transfer school?

Children are due to transfer to secondary school at the end of Year 6 of a primary/junior school and to transfer to an upper school at the end of Year 8 of a middle school.

Who can make an application?

Parents/carers are responsible for making a school place application for any children within their care due to transfer to a secondary/upper school in September 2019. A legal definition of parent/carer is included in the glossary at the back of this booklet.

Where shared care arrangements are in place and parents/carers of the child submit two separate applications for different schools, the Local Authority (LA) will only accept one application, which will be the application made by the parent/carer that lives at the same permanent home address as the child. Where there are exceptional grounds such as ongoing court proceedings, these applications will be considered on a case by case basis.

Where it is necessary to establish the child's permanent home address, parents/carers will be asked to write to the LA stating the number of days each week the child spends with them. The LA may also ask for evidence of which parent/carer was in receipt of child benefit at the point of application. If the parent/carer is not in receipt of child benefit, the LA will ask for proof of the child's home address as held by the doctor's surgery at the point of application. If the child's home address cannot be verified, the LA may request further information.

Please be aware, if you are applying for a school place for your child and your child does not live with you permanently then information will also be sent to your child's permanent home address.



Documentary evidence of home ownership or suitable rental agreement may be required, together with proof of permanent residence at the property concerned. Places cannot be allocated on the basis of an intended future address, unless the house move can be confirmed through the formal 'exchange of contracts' or the signing of a minimum of a six month formal tenancy agreement from a letting agency. Please note: private letting agreements may not be accepted as proof of residence. An address change due to a move to live with other family members or friends will not be considered until the move has taken place and other suitable proof of residency has been obtained. Proof that a move from the previous address has taken place may also be required e.g. proof of exchange of contracts, a tenancy agreement showing the end date of the tenancy or a notice to quit from the landlord or repossession notice. The LA reserve the right to seek further documentary evidence to support any claim of residence which could include contacting the estate agent, solicitor, landlord or relevant professional. A representative of the LA may carry out a home visit(s) without prior notice to verify a pupil's home address.


An address used for childcare arrangements cannot be used as a home address for the purpose of applying for a school place.

Proof of address for Voluntary Controlled (VC) and Community Schools will not be required for traveller families where the address is confirmed by the Traveller Education Service. A foster carer will not be required to supply proof of address for a child placed with them by an LA.

For admission allocation purposes, in most cases the address that will be taken into consideration is the address at which the child is resident at the closing date or an address at which the child will be resident before the start of the new academic year in September 2019, providing the change of address is notified and evidence provided before the exceptional circumstance deadline of 3rd December 2018. However, own Admission Authority school's arrangements may vary (please **CLICK HERE** to see links to the criteria on Page 20).

It is very important that you notify the LA of an intended change of address in these circumstances as this will determine the catchment or nearest school for the child concerned.

The LA will consider withdrawing the offer of a place at a Community or Voluntary Controlled (VC) school if an address used to support an application is subsequently found to be fraudulent or misleading.



Important points to consider before making your application

How important is my address?

The home address is very important, as school places are allocated on the basis of the permanent home address of each child. A child's permanent home address is considered to be where the child spends the majority of their time with parents or carers. Where the child spends equal time with both parents, the Admission Authority may ask for additional information, including evidence of which parent/carer is in receipt of child benefit and/or the name of the GP surgery at which the child is registered.



Can I choose any school?

Parents have a legal right to express a preference for any school(s) they would like their child(ren) to attend. In Somerset you can choose up to 3 preferences in ranked order.

How can I find out more about my local schools before I apply?

The best way to find out more about schools is to visit them. Contact the school(s) direct for further information. You can also:

- Visit the school website.
- Attend the open day/evenings.
- Look at the schools performance tables at <u>www.gov.uk/school-performance-tables</u>.
- Obtain a copy of the school's most recent OFSTED (The Office for Standards in Education) inspection report. These are available from the school or can be viewed at your local library or on the internet at the following website: www.ofsted.gov.uk.
- View the published GCSE examination results for secondary/upper schools for the summer of 2018. This can be found on the Department for Education website www.education.gov.uk.
- Visit www.somersetchoices.org.uk.

Do I have to state my catchment school as one of my preferences?

If you would like your child to be considered for your catchment school, you will need to include it as one of your preferences. However, this does not guarantee a place at this school. You can find your catchment school on our website <u>www.somerset.gov.uk/admissions</u> or by contacting Somerset Direct on **0300 123 2224**.

Some schools and academies that are their own Admission Authority do not prioritise children living in the catchment area of the school in their over-subscription criteria. If you think you live in the catchment area of a school or academy but the school or academy does not include catchment area in their over-subscription criteria (**CLICK HERE** for links to the criteria on Page 20), it is recommended that one of the preferences expressed is for the nearest school to your home address. However, please note this does not guarantee your child a place at this school. Please contact us if you are not sure which school is nearest.

Writhlington School (Bath & North East Somerset)

A special arrangement exists for children living in Holcombe, Hemington, Coleford and Kilmersdon. The catchment school is Writhlington School which is in Bath and North East Somerset. Please contact Bath and North East Somerset Local Authority to obtain the school's over-subscription criteria – CLICK HERE or see page 24 for contact details.



Important

If your catchment school is not stated as one of your preferences and becomes over-subscribed, we cannot guarantee your child a place at that school.



My child is in the last year of a middle school. Can I apply for a secondary school?

We are unable to consider requests for places into a secondary school as part of the transferring to upper school process.

This is because a secondary school already has established year groups running from Year 7 to Year 11 and therefore this would be an in year admission.

If you wish to request a year 9 place at a secondary school for your child for September 2019, you will need to make an in-year application (**CLICK HERE** or see page 18 for further details).

Does my child's current school influence their next school place?

Priority is given in the LA over-subscription criteria for out of catchment children who are transferring to an upper school and are attending the middle school within that school's catchment area.

Some schools, where the Governing Body is the Admissions Authority, prioritise specific named feeder schools as part of their over-subscription criteria. Please check the over-subscription criteria for the schools you wish to apply for.

What is a Supplementary Information Form (SIF)?

Where additional information to support your school place application is required, you may need to fill out a Supplementary Information Form (SIF). For example, a SIF will need to be completed by your church representative if you are applying for a school place under religious grounds.

SIF's can be obtained from the particular school website or for VC schools from the LA website **www.somerset.gov.uk/admissions**.

What do I need to do if I want to apply for a **Church school?**

Confirmation of church attendance or any involvement with the work and worship of the church must be confirmed on a SIF and returned by the published deadline. For VC schools, this can be found on www.somerset.gov.uk/admissions.

For own Admission Authority church schools, please see the individual school website for a definition of religious criteria and where to obtain a SIF (see glossary for definitions of different school types).

For VC schools the SIF states that The Diocese of Bath and Wells recommends to the clergy that the child or a parent has attended actual worship and that attendance at toddler groups or other activities that are held at the church does NOT meet the requirements.

Do I follow the same application procedure if my child has an Education, Health and Care plan?

If you are applying for a mainstream school, you must still complete and return the application form and be sure to indicate Special Educational Needs in the appropriate section on your application form. If you wish to apply for a Special School, you will need to contact the SEND (Special Educational Needs & Disabilities) Team direct. There would also have been an opportunity to discuss your views on your child's next placement at their last Annual Review meeting.

If a child has an Education, Health and Care plan which names a particular school, then the Admission Authority for that school has a duty to admit the child. Where possible, the Admissions Authority will take these admissions into account before the published offer day and will include these admissions within the published admission number.

The LA has a duty to make suitable provision for children who have Special Educational Needs and to make appropriate education available in mainstream or specialist schools. Wherever possible, the LA will try to place children with Special Educational Needs in mainstream schools. The needs of the majority of children can be met from the resources available to the schools, including advice from the area support services.

My child does not have an Education, Health and Care plan but has special needs, will this be taken into account?

In Somerset, Community and VC schools give priority to children who do not have an Education, Health and Care plan but whose needs can be verified by a multi-agency professional team, where it is recognised that a particular school is required to meet their specific needs. (CLICK **HERE** to see links to over-subscription criteria on page 20). Evidence to support this application must be received by the Admissions and Entitlements Team on or before 3rd December 2018. An on-time application form must previously have been submitted for the child concerned. For further information regarding these arrangements please call Somerset Direct on 0300 123 2224.

For Academies, Free schools, Voluntary Aided and Foundation schools, you will need to check the individual over-subscription criteria to see if this applies.

Do I need to consider travel arrangements when choosing a school for my child?

We will provide free school travel assistance to children who attend their designated transport area or nearest school and also live more than the statutory walking distance of 3 miles for children aged eight years old and

What is an All-Through School?

An all-through school covers Reception through to the end of Year 11 i.e. primary and secondary phase combined.

Parents who have children on roll at an all through school do not need to make a separate secondary school application for the same school. However, if your child is not currently on roll at an all-through school and you would like to apply for the secondary phase, you will need to make an application by the published deadline.

Can I apply for a Local Authority maintained school outside of Somerset?

Yes. If you live in Somerset please apply on-line and list the names of any schools you wish to apply for on the application form and ensure it is received by Somerset LA by 31st October 2018.

Please note that the published Admission Arrangements for another county may be different from those in Somerset. You must ensure that you fully understand the published Admission Arrangements and oversubscription criteria applying to the school concerned before you make your application and to find out if you need to complete a SIF.

What if I do not need a place at a Local Authority School or an Academy?

If you are making alternative arrangements for your child's education such as an independent school or home education please inform us of this in writing as soon as possible so that we can update your child's record. For information regarding home education, please visit our website www.somerset.gov.uk/admissions.

Please note, if you are considering a place at an Independent school then you must make your application directly to the school concerned. For further information please contact the Independent Schools Council (CLICK HERE or see page 24 for contact details).



Can I apply for a year 10 place in September at a University Technical College (UTC) or a Studio school for my child?

If you have a child due to move into Year 10 you can choose to apply for a place at a studio school or a UTC for your child. University Technical Colleges (UTCs) are set up by universities and businesses and specialise in one or two technical subjects. At GCSE they offer a similar curriculum to a typical secondary school, including the basics of English and Maths, as well as their specialist subject.

Studio schools are similar to UTCs in that they have employer involvement in the curriculum and focus on developing the skills needed for employment, involving personal coaching and work experience, alongside a similar curriculum to a typical secondary school.

There are no studio schools or UTCs in Somerset but please see a list below of those that can be found in neighbouring authorities. For further information please visit the individual school website or if you would like to apply for any of these schools please contact the School Admissions Team or check the school website in order to find out whether you need to make an application through Somerset LA or directly to the school.

How do I apply for a school?

If you are applying online, please choose the No UID (Unique Identification Number) option on the on-line form, as Somerset do not use these.

Complete the online application form at www.somerset.gov.uk/ admissions stating your preferred schools in ranked order. This will remain active until 23:59 on the published closing date, 31st October 2018.

If you do not have access to the internet, then you may apply using the application form, which can be obtained by calling Somerset Direct on 0300 123 2224. This will need to be received by the published closing date, 31st October 2018.

If you choose to make a paper application, you will not receive e-mail notification of your school place application on National Offer Day. Instead, a letter will be posted 2nd class to your home address on this date. Outcomes will NOT be given out over the phone.

Ensure you have completed any necessary SIF(s) that are required. Please ensure you have fully completed your application form and if you have applied online ensure that it has been submitted properly and you have received a confirmation e-mail. You will need to re-submit your online form if you view or make any changes at a later date.

If you have not made a school place application for your child and the deadline is approaching, we will try to contact you by text message or letter to remind you to make an application by the deadline

Supporting information in respect of on-time applications will be accepted up to 3rd December 2018 under the following circumstances;

- moves into or across Somerset where evidence of a property move is required (evidence of exchange of contracts or proof of tenancy/rental agreement for a minimum 6 months will be necessary).
- If relevant in the school's over-subscription criteria; where a parent carer considers their child(ren) to have Special Educational Needs or other specific needs, but the child(ren) does not have an EHC plan naming a particular school.

If an application is made to Somerset LA in error, we will attempt to pass this on to the correct LA or contact the applicant direct. However, please note that it remains the responsibility of the applicant to apply to the correct home LA.



Important

Any change of preference submitted online or by paper application on or before the published deadline date will over-ride any previous applications.

School Place Application Check List

Research the schools that you are considering applying for (e.g. view the school(s) websites, contact the school for a visit, look at the school prospectus, attend open days/evenings, visit the OFSTED website, view the GCSE results on the DfE website).

Think about how your child will get to school.

Express a preference of 3 schools in preferred, ranked order.

Strongly consider stating your catchment and/or nearest school as one of your preferences.

Make sure you fully complete the question regarding siblings if relevant (if not, your application may not be considered under this criterion).

Ensure you have completed the appropriate SIF for each school you have applied for and returned to the correct address (if not, your application may not be considered under the appropriate criterion).

Ensure your application is received by the closing date of 31st October 2018.

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How will places be allocated?

The Published Admission Number (PAN)

Every school has a legal Published Admission Number (PAN) applicable to the year of entry, which indicates the maximum number of places available in the year group concerned.

The PAN is set to maximise parental preference within the resources and accommodation available.

If there are less applications than the PAN (i.e. places available), every child will be allocated a place. However if a school receives more applications than the PAN (in other words is over-subscribed) the published over-subscription criteria will be applied to determine which children should be offered the available places.

Places will be allocated using the 'Equal Preference with Ranking' method. This requires the Admissions Authority to consider all preferences received for a particular school (1st, 2nd and 3rd) equally and where the school is over-subscribed apply the over-subscription criteria. Where more than one of your preferences can be met the LA will offer you a place at your highest ranked preference.

What will happen if a school does not have enough places for every child who applies?

Unfortunately, at some schools, there will not be enough places for all the children whose parents would like them to go there. When all places have been allocated up to the PAN, the Admission Authority may refuse any further requests.



Important

You must ensure that your appeal application form is completed and returned by the published appeal application closing date (29th March 2019).

If your appeal application is late, then it may not be considered until all 'on time' appeal applications have been heard.

It may not be possible for the Admission Authority to offer your child a place at your highest preference school, however you may still be offered a place at your second or third preference school. On some occasions it may not be possible for an Admissions Authority to offer your child a place at any of your preferred schools. If this is the case, the LA would normally offer the catchment school if there are places available. If this is not the case the LA would try to offer a place at the nearest alternative school with places available within statutory walking distance of the child's home address (3 miles for children aged 8 years and over).

Making an Appeal.

If you are not offered one or more of your preferences you will be advised of your legal right to appeal for a place at your preferred school(s). Information regarding the appeal process will be sent to you with your outcome letter or email, detailing your options.

Please note that your appeal will not affect any offer you have already received in respect of another school, unless you are successful at your appeal.

Places becoming available.

For every over-subscribed school a ranked waiting list will be held in order of over-subscription criteria by the Admissions Authority until at least the end of the Autumn term.

For VC & C schools, make a written request to the LA in order for your child to remain on the waiting list after this time. For own admission authority schools you will need to check the individual school or academies admission arrangements on their website.

If places subsequently become available within the PAN they will be reallocated to the highest ranked child on the waiting list. The waiting list will include all applications refused whether they were on-time or late and will be ranked according to the school's over-subscription criteria.

What if I miss the deadline or want to change my preference(s) after the closing date?

For applications received between 1st November 2018 and 22nd March 2019, we will aim to send outcomes on 3rd May 2019. After this date, applications will be processed in strict date order of receipt.

If a change of preference is received and can be offered, the previous school place offer will automatically be withdrawn. It is not possible to withdraw a late application with a change of preference once the closing date has been passed.

General Information

Can my child transfer school earlier or later?

If you feel there are exceptional reasons why your child should be kept back a year (delayed admission) or transfer school a year early you may request this.

This is an important decision and a number of factors need to be taken into consideration. Therefore, please ensure you carefully read this important information first.

You must still make an on-time school place application but may apply for your child's admission to be delayed or for them to transfer school a year early at the same time. Please click here for an application form.

If it is agreed that your child's admission can be delayed or they can transfer a year early this will only apply specifically to that school. Therefore we recommend that you request delayed admission or to transfer a year early at all your preferred schools, not just your first preference school. We would also recommend that you include your catchment school as one of your preferences. This does not quarantee a place but does provide a priority in most cases.

Your school place application will be considered against the Published Admission Number for each school and the over-subscription criteria will be applied should the school have more applicants than there are places available. Should we be unable to offer a place at any of your preferences there is no guarantee that delayed admission or to transfer school a year early would be agreed at an alternative school.

Decisions will be made on a case by case basis by the admission authority of each school. The Head teacher of each school will be consulted as part of this process. The admissions authority must clearly set out the reasons for the decision in writing.

As long as you have made an on-time school place application we will ensure you receive an outcome to your request before the secondary national offer date.

If your request for delayed entry is agreed, your school place application will be withdrawn before a place is offered and you will then need to make a new school place application for the following year.

If your request for early admission is agreed, your school place application will be processed and you will receive an outcome on the National Offer Day.

If your request is refused, there is no right of appeal against the decision not to allow your child to be admitted outside of their normal age group.

If your child has had delayed admission or a request to transfer school early agreed, you may be unable to apply on-line as the system will not recognise your child's date of birth. Please contact us for advice in these circumstances.



Siblings

Priority is given in the published LA Admission Arrangements for siblings where there is an existing sibling link at the time of admission. However, no guarantee is given that siblings can attend the same school when the school is over-subscribed.

Your child's place will remain available for 20 school days from the first day of the Autumn term.

adopted

The Admissions Authority has a duty to give the highest priority within the over-subscription criteria to children in Local Authority Care (Looked After Children) or those children who were previously looked after and are now formally adopted or subject to a residence/child arrangement order or special guardianship order. You may be required to submit a copy of the adoption order, residence/child arrangement order or special guardianship order and a letter from the LA that last looked after the child confirming that he or she was looked after immediately prior to that order being made.

In Year Admissions

Applications for children of school age moving to an existing year group in another school outside of the starting or transferring school process are called In Year Admissions.

Applications must be made directly to the preferred school(s) using an application form that can be obtained directly from the school or from the LA. Decisions will be taken by the Admissions Authority who must also inform parents of their right to appeal against the refusal of a place.

If your child is refused a place at a VC or C school, they will be placed on a waiting list until the end of the academic year. If your child is refused a place at an own admission authority school, you will need to contact the school or check the admission arrangements on their website to find out if they keep a waiting list. All waiting lists must be held in order of oversubscription criteria and re-ranked every time a child is added to or leaves the waiting list.

In Year Admissions - Children of UK Service Personnel.

Somerset LA endeavour to ensure that Admission Arrangements in their area support the Government's commitment to removing disadvantage for service children.

In year applications are usually considered for admission up to a maximum of half a term in advance of the place being required. An exception is made for children of UK service personnel with a confirmed posting to the area and crown servants returning from overseas to live in the area. A place can be made available up to a year in advance of being required providing the appropriate documentation is provided as proof of posting (an official Government letter e.g. MOD, FCO or GCHQ declaring a relocation date and intended posting).

Usually, an in year place may be allocated prior to actual residency, only on receipt of exchange of contracts or a formal signed rental agreement. An exception is made for children of UK service personnel with a confirmed posting to the area and crown servants returning from overseas to live in the area. This means that, providing the application is accompanied by an official Government letter (e.g. MOD, FCO or GCHQ) declaring a relocation date and intended posting, the Admissions Authority will process the application. If proof of a home address is not available at this stage Somerset LA will use a unit postal address or quartering area address to process the application.

If the parent/carer is moving to the area without a posting or as a result of leaving the armed forces then no special consideration will be given to the application under the grounds of the application being made by a service family.



School Travel Assistance

travel assistance?

If you applied for your child's school place using a paper application form, this information will be included in your outcome letter. If you applied for your child's school place online, you will receive a second email within 10 working days of your school place outcome email, if your child is entitled to travel assistance. If you do not receive a second email this means your child has been assessed as not entitled to free school travel assistance.

Travel assistance entitlement is only assessed to the designated transport area or neareast school over the statutory 2/3 mile walking distance. If you wish for your child's travel assistance entitlement to be assessed under low income grounds, you will need to make a separate application. This can be done at www.somerset.gov.uk/schooltransport

If you are not entitled to free school travel assistance but would like the decision reviewed, you will need to contact the Roads and Transport team on 0300 123 2224 in the first instance.

Transport areas for schools match the catchment area for that school as at September 2012. If an Admission Authority has changed the catchment area for their school, there is no automatic change to the transport area. Transport areas are set by the Local Authority and can only be changed folowing a full public consultation.

Accepting an offer of school transport assistance

You will be sent a medical needs form with the outcome letter or email offering travel assistance for your child. You must return this within 21 days to accept the offer of travel assistance and to inform us of any medical needs your child may have. If you do not accept the offer of travel assistance, a place will not be reserved for your child.

Glossary of Terms:

Academy (A): Independently managed, all-ability schools. Set up by sponsors from business, faith or voluntary groups in partnership with the Department for Education (DfE) and the LA. Together they fund the land and buildings, with the government covering the running costs.

Admissions Arrangements: The overall procedure, practices and over-subscription criteria used in deciding the allocation of school places including any means used to determine whether a school place is to be offered.

Admissions Authority: The body responsible for admissions to a school. For all C and VC schools, the LA is the Admissions Authority. For all VA and F schools, the Governing Body is the admissions authority and for Academies

and Free Schools it is the Academy Trust. Catchment Area: A geographical area from which children may be afforded priority for admission to a school. A catchment area is part of a school's Admission Arrangements and must therefore be consulted upon, determined and published in the same way as other Admission Arrangements. Catchment School: The school designated to your home address.

Community School (C): Provided and maintained by the LA.

C of E: Church of England.

Child Looked After - A 'looked after' child or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence or special guardianship order. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of their social services functions.

DfE: Department for Education - the Central Government Department responsible for Education in England and Wales.

Education, Health and Care plan: A legal document issued by the LA specifying the needs, resources and provision required to support the child and can include a named school that is suitable for providing education for that child.

Foundation School (F): Maintained by the LA.

Free School (FS): Free Schools are nonprofit making, independent, state-funded schools.

Home address: This is the child's permanent address at which they live with a person who has parental responsibility as the main carer (as set down by law).

Home Authority: The local authority area in which you live.

Infant Class Size Legislation: The School Standards and Framework Act 1998 placed a duty on local authorities (LAs) and schools to limit the size of infant classes for five-, six-, and seven-year-olds taught by one teacher to 30 or fewer pupils.

ISC: Independent Schools Council. Provides information on Independent Schools.

LA: Local Authority. Somerset County Council is the LA for Somerset.

OFSTED: Office for Standards in Education - the school inspection service for Central Government. Reports of inspections are available from the website www.ofsted. gov.uk.

On-line application: An application made via the Somerset County Council LA website.

Other Local Authority: An authority other than your home authority.

Over-subscribed: A school is oversubscribed where more applications are submitted than there are places available within the PAN.

Over-subscription Criteria: The Admissions Authority for the school will apply the published over-subscription criteria to decide priority for places.

PAN: Published Admission Number this is the maximum number of places an Admissions Authority can normally allocate in the intake year group. The PAN is reviewed annually by the Admissions Authority.

Parent or parent/carer: Natural parents, whether they are married or not, any person who, although not a natural parent, has parental responsibility for a child or young person. Any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child or young person (having care of a child or young person means that a person with whom the child lives and who looks after the child, irrespective of what their relationship is with the child, is considered to be a parent in education law).

Preference: The school(s) you would prefer your child(ren) to attend.

RC: Roman Catholic.

Sibling: For the purposes of admissions, Somerset LA defines a sibling as a child living permanently at the same address as a half or full brother or sister, an adoptive brother or sister or children of the same household.

Statutory Walking Distance: The national standard used to measure entitlement to travel assistance to school and the availability of an alternative school, measured along the shortest available walking route.

Supplementary Information Forms (SIF): A document that may be required to support your application for a preferred school(s) under a specific criterion of the over-subscription criteria.

Transport Area: Area within which a family must live in order to be considered for travel assistance.

Under-subscribed: A school is undersubscribed if there are fewer applications received than places available within the PAN.

VA school: Voluntary Aided School – these are Roman Catholic or Church of England schools, provided by the Church and maintained by the LA.

VC school: Voluntary Controlled School these are mainly Church schools (Church of England).
